Due to the way the Methodist Church is structured, we have had many ministers come to us through the years. Pastor Allen Pebley was a very unique one!

He arrived in Uniondale during a big rain storm, along with his wife, Patsy, and her brother, Raymond. At that time, Uniondale had almost no sewer system, so as the rain kept falling, the water in the church basement kept rising. Yes, you might say “the rains came down and the water came up”. ☺

The men brought in pumps, but they couldn’t keep up with the rising water. Some men stayed in the church all night, keeping watch. After the rain stopped, the fire department had to come and pump out the water, of course, leaving a layer of mud to clean up.

That was the beginning of Pastor Allen’s stay with us. From 1981 to 1986, he kept things lively, always!
